Unfortunately, only about half the club took advantage of this wonderful event and simply put, you missed a great time and you were missed.


A major thank you for those who helped get the fair display ready and for setting it up at the complex. For all those who volunteered for to cover a shift your involvement is deeply appreciated by the club.

This month, DCC troubleshooting on the N scale layout, a companion to the last month's article PROBLEMS?? THINGS TO TRY for the HO layout.

based on a Digitrax DSC51 command station, known as a Zephyr Extra. The Zephyr is the source of DCC track power that is encoded with the information to command decoders in the locos. The command station is also the source of a network Digitrax calls loconet. The loconet is a six wire network that allows layout devices to communicate. One of those devices is Digitrax handheld controller like a DT402d or a UT4. These devices can connect to the loconet via the front fascia connections located around the layout. These handhelds talk to the command station and the command station issues commands to the loco via the track power. Using these Digitrax handhelds will always be the most reliable handheld control method

Unlike the HO layout, the N scale Zephyr Extra command station has all the controls needed to operate a loco in DCC. So if walk-around or remote operations are not required, simply use the front panel controls. If handheld control is desired, there are two choices, the Digitrax controllers or a personal smart phone or tablet.

Using personal handhelds, connected via WiFi add another layer of complexity.

1. The CMRC-N WiFi uses the laptop computer. A separate WiFi router and a connection to the

loconet using a USB cable to a Digitrax device called a PR3. Because of this, using the CMRC-N WiFi can be more problematic. Issues with the Windows operating system and JMRI programs & features are harder to trouble shoot and are beyond the scope of this document. If you can operate with either a Digitrax handheld and the CMRC-N WiFi will not, please leave a note for the N scale coordinator.

\*If the loco stops periodically, the Zephyr is probably The Digitrax DCC system on the N scale is still using that cab number. Press Loco button and then Exit. The display should read "Loco".

> \*Using DT402d or DT500 with a fresh battery, try running the loco. This is the most reliable handheld method of operating DCC. Remember to plug the DT throttle to the fascia socket to initialize the throttle to the N scale layout, after initialization, the handheld can be unplugged and used wirelessly.

> \*Assure the loop you are using is set to DCC. The three loop selector switches are just above the power packs. Be aware these switches have a center off location and have to be fully up (DCC) or down (DC) to power their respective loop.

> \*Assure DCC track power is on. The red track status light on the Zephyr should be illuminated. If not, press the upper left button marked Power.

> \*When using a smartphone or tablet, assure device is on correct WiFi network. Use CMRC-N.

\*Cycle the power (REBOOT) your handheld device.

\*Will the loco run on DC? Does loco have a decoder?

\*Has loco been programmed to cab number? If not, try using 03 as cab number.

\*Try using known good loco on same track.

The Marketing Committee met on August 8, 2019, with 6 members in attendance.

2021 Calendar Update: Goal to have the calendars ready for sale by August 2000. Pat has a local printer who will print the calendar at a reasonable cost for us. Pat will announce a special photo shoot for the calendar for all CMRC members. This will be on the updated, and has received over 1,000 hits on a recent back cover of the calendar. All members in the photo are requested to wear a Club shirt for the photo. All interior calendar photos will be of views from within the CMRC suite this time around.

Members discussed the idea of considering a CMRC Club vest, which may be more practical than a shirt. Paul has also found a source for consideration. Will discuss further at our next meeting.

Historical Booklet for our 2021 Anniversary Update: Bill Bly needs stories on our history and will be contacting members for assistance. He may also put an article in an upcoming issue of our newsletter.

The group discussed large signage for the exterior of the Outlet Center. Since the meeting, Art has met with Chip and obtained approval for us to PM. place a large sign as a replacement for the 'Dress Barn' sign at the northeast corner of the Mall (our location). Once the BOD approval is obtained, we will contact a sign company for a cost estimate of sign and installation. Cost should be minimal, as the sign is merely a vinyl covering stretched over an existing frame. For those not knowing, "Dress Barn" will be closing all their stores by the end of this year.

Art also requested that the Outlet Center return the Parking Lot designations to a post in the designated lots. The removal of the old ones to the entrance doors creates an issue for visiting patrons who

cannot see any lot designations while driving. Chip concurred.

Paul showed us a sample of a steam engine for use on the interior sign on the stanchion in the hall. The group agreed to some minor modifications (details, color, etc.) prior to manufacturing the sign.

Bill reported that our Facebook page has been post.

As we are running extremely low on our Trifolds, Art authorized Pat to order 1,000 new ones (with a change to our website) to tide us over until Bill provides his ideas for a newly designed Tri-fold for future use. Update: Tri-folds were ordered, received, and are being folded for use at the County Fair, and subsequent uses.

A copy of the Marketing Committee Budget & Expenditures will be provided by Art to the Committee at their request on a monthly basis. Bill B. also requested that an agenda be sent to the members prior to our Committee meetings.

\*Do you have any control? For example, can you turn lights on/off? Sound horn? If do, the problem rests with the loco. Maybe decoder programming or loco internal wiring.

Remember, one-on-one DCC training is always available, so let us know. We are here to help.




