News from the NMRA

With the closing down of many of the activities we have all learned to enjoy, it gives NMRA members an opportunity to work on various projects for their own layouts.

One good example is Bobbi Dean who has just finished the last three structures needed to complete all the requirements for her "Structures Certificate of Achievement".

For each of these three structures, she was awarded a "Merit Award". In the structures category, you have to construct 12 structures, one of which

must be a bridge. These must be six different structure types and six of the structures must be scratch built. Six of the 12 structures must be awarded 87.5 points out of 125, thus earning a Merit Award.

In a recent conversation with Bobbi, she indicated that she has started construction of some rolling stock as she works toward her "Rolling Stock Certificate of Achievement".

Congratulations Bobbi on the completion of these structures and the requirements for the Structures certificate.

Our HO environment: When operating in DCC, the DCC system on the HO layout is based on a Digitrax DCS200 command station. The command station is the source of DCC track power that is encoded with the information to command decoders in the locos. Using personal handhelds like smart phones and tablets using WiFi add another layer of complexity. As complexity increases, reliability decreases.

Dtx1-The first and simplest CMRC HO1 08B4-7 wifi network. Select it on your connections menu of your device. After selecting it, you will be prompted for the passcode, digitrax1234. This network that uses a Digitrax wifi device, called an *Will loco run on DC? Does loco have a decoder?

LNWI, that provides a direct connection between the Loconet and the DTX WiFi it produces. The tower laptop is NOT needed or used for this connection.

The second and more complex CMRC-HO WiFi uses the laptop computer, a separate WiFi router and a connection to the Loconet using a usb cable to a device called a PR3. Because of this using the CMRC-Welcome, come on in and get comfortable. HO WiFi can be the most problematic. Issues with the tures are harder to troubleshoot and are beyond the scope of this document. If you can operate with either a Digitrax handheld or a personal device connected to the DTX WiFi, and the CMRC-HO WiFi will not, please leave a note for the HO Coordinator.

PROBLEMS?? THINGS TO TRY

*Using DT402d with fresh battery, try running loco. This is most reliable method of operating DCC.

*Assure DCC track power is on. The tower display (top left side) should show 12 volts minimum.

*Cycle the power on DCC power supply. Green switch on PS2012, shelf under tower-right side. Leave off for 10 seconds.

*When using smart phone or tablet, assure device is on correct WiFi network.


*Cycle power (REBOOT) your handheld device

*Has loco been programmed to cab number? If not, try using 03 as cab number.

*Try using known good loco on same track.

*Do you have any control? For example, can you turn lights on/off? Sound horn? If so, the problem rests with the loco. Maybe decoder programming or loco wiring.

Remember, one-on-one DCC training is always available, so let us know. We are here to help. If you experience any unexplained issues with the current DCC installations, HO or N, please document what you have encountered in an E-mail, or a note to Paul andArt. Buildings are starting to appear in the redesigned yard.

The final siding has been completed.

All Tortoise switch machines are operational.

While the remaining buildings are being constructed, we will continue to test the track to insure a smooth operation before ballasting.

We have moved onto the sawmill siding and have installed three Tortoises.

WE have also lengthened the passing siding in the process.

The wiring is now underway.

When completed, all turnouts near the control panel will have been converted to Tortoise control.

N Scale Drive-In Start Procedures

As we have many new members and because of the long period of time since we last posted these procedures, we thought it may be appropriate for all to review them.

To start the operation of the theater, follow this procedure:

- 1. Once the track power is turned on, press the "Red On" button on the remote. Be sure the remote is pointed at the DVD player located beneath the Drive-In. Be sure the curtain is pulled back to give you a clear path between the remote and the DVD player.
- 2. Push the "Play" button and wait until the movie starts.
- 3. Push the "Repeat" button three times slowly and "Title" will appear on the top left of the screen.

This allows the movie to continue repeatedly until you turn it off at the end of the shift.
