

Come in and get comfortable.

Let's talk about decoders that seem to have a mind of their own. In some ways they do have a mind of their own...they have memory chips. Losing its mind does not necessarily mean the decoder is defective, it is more likely misconfigured. Something has changed and a CV (Configuration Variable) needs to be properly set again. Decoders often have dozens of CV's, or hundreds in some of the very talented decoders (think sound decoders). This makes finding the CV that needs to be "fixed" very difficult. The easier way is to reset the decoder. Resetting is a technique that is built in to the decoder to return it to its as-new condition.

There are standards from the NMRA DCC Standards that allows us to operate the many different manufacturer's decoders together on a DCC system. All DCC decoders that follow the standards for voltages and communications are compliant and will respond to the various DCC command systems like NCE, Lenz and Digitrax.


However, the NMRA standards do not include any mention of how to reset a troublesome decoder. Many decoder manufacturers have elected to involve CV8 for the reset procedure. CV8 has been defined in the NMRA Standard as the location to hold the manufacturer ID. CV8 cannot be modified as it is a read only CV. Examples would be TCS #153, Digitrax #129 and Tsunami is #141. The ID is important because different companies use different techniques and the

ID can lead you to the method required. So if your ID in CV8 is #129 (Digitrax) you send the decoder a 08 while on the programming track and it is reset. Easy? Well, not always. Some will need a power booster. Others will need a power off cycle. Some, like NCE CV8 #11, you set CV30 = 2. Okay, still pretty easy. But wait, there is more, some QSI decoders need a "magic wand", okay not magic, just a magnet to flip a reed switch under the shell. Some other QSI have a multiple step process; (1) Place engine on main track if it is still responding to its address. If not responding, you may need to use the program track...(2) Set CV49 to 128...(3) Set CV50 to 255..(4)Set CV56 to 113. As the engine resets, you will hear the 3 toots.

The good news is many times this will return your decoder to a faithful servant. Oh, there is one more step after this process. The cab number will be 3. But test the loco at 3 before setting the cab number desired.

So it is important to know what decoder is in your loco. Remember the reset is back to factory new so any customizations you have done will be undone. Maybe say a sound or lighting function.

These steps can be accomplished with any method at your disposal on the command station you



are using. At the Club's HO layout you can use a Digitrax handheld like the DT402d or the attached JMRI connected laptop.

Next month-an easier way. Stay tuned.
