

Time you work will count towards the NMRA Achievement program.






This year "Santa" was on the receiving end as he continues to be a "good little boy".

Welcome to 2022! Happy New Year! Let's ideas. step outside this month and jump in the weeds. The DCC weeds that is. Which DCC system is the best? The easiest? The most talented? The most inexpensive? Many system manufacturers (and their \$\$\$) come to mind for those answers. NCE, Lenz, Digitrax are but a few. How about a new manufacturer. A do It Yourself one.

Using two small inexpensive off-the-shelf components one can assemble the parts required to create a basic DCC command station. It has connections for both a running track and a separate programming track. All for under \$38.00. Sounds too god to be true? Well a bit of fine print here. You need a couple bits of 20 gauge wire, a USB cable, a 2 amp. 12 volt DC power supply and a computer running JMRI. You need those things too if you just purchased a brand named command station.

Just simply shopping at Amazon, the Arduino microprocessor Uno Rev 3 is \$20.00 and a L296P ShieldcRev 3 DC Motor Driver is \$17.99. Others may even be less expensive.

The software to make it all work is Free!

If this sounds interesting to you and you would like to build one for yourself, let The Shed know and we can do some together. Maybe a clinic or two. And best yet, no soldering required.

Remember, one-on-one DCC training is always available, so let us know. We are here to help.

The issue with the laptop not responding at the start of the shift continues. A work around is coming soon where the laptop will be off as the default and can be started if you need to use the CMRC-HO WiFi connection.

Look for new procedures to be posted soon on the HO tower. This will mean the

Dtx1-CMRC_HO1_08B4-7 wifi network will be the primary.

There is an Ops session planned for January 10 at noon. Remember all are invited.

DC will continue to be the default condition when powering down at the end of the shift. All loop switched should be in the up (DC) position and the DC power packs should be off before the main power is turned off. Remember to park the trains near the tower.
