As coordinator, I want to thank all the members who gave the time to assist in the painful tasks of removing and storing the HO assets. All your help was very appreciated. Thank you.



AS a charter member of the Crossville Model Railroad Club, this is a very sad time for me. When we started this club in 2001, we had 11 charter members and I don't think any of us would have imagined that we would have 60 members now.

Besides putting an article in the Chronicle and Glade Sun about our closing, Jim and visited the County Mayor, Allen Foster, although he sympathized with us, there was not much else he could do for us. He did mention that the hospital owned the building across Main Street from the Palace Theater. We left the Mayor's office and drove directly to the hospital, to the Administrator's office and waited an hour for him to get out of a meeting (which was only supposed to last 10 minutes or so). However he did call me that afternoon, apologized for our wait. After a few questions, he admitted he didn't know much about the building and would introduce me to the man cho could answer my questions. It turns out that besides needing a new roof, there were too many repairs needed inside for us to afford (according to him).

we had conversations with the County Mayor, Allen Foster, City Mayor Crawford and councilman Art Gernt and all of them confirmed that the depot would not be available for lease as that is the only meeting place for birthday parties, weddings and is already booked for the year.

I have had many phone calls from Carolyn Jozwick (from "Downtown Crossville Inc.) - she had had several calls from business people wanting us to locate downtown. So far these buildings have not panned out. I also got a call from the mayor of Harriman, TN saying if we cant find anything in Crossville, they would find something for us in Harriman,

Two days after my article appeared in the paper, I got a call from a man in North Carolina who comes every year to Crossville to visit CMRC. He was appreciative of our talents and offered to come and help us pack.
