

Policies of the Crossville Railroad Historical Society

Revised September 15, 2026

1. The Crossville Railroad Historical Society, hereafter referred to as CRHS, shall function as the legal entity and owner of the property at 87 West Avenue in the city of Crossville, Tennessee.
2. It will hold the fiduciary responsibilities for all expenditures associated with the property at 87 West Avenue in the city of Crossville, Tennessee.
3. All publicly donated funds, whether directly made to the society or through monies collected at public events, will be recorded and held by the elected treasurer of the society.
4. The books, ledgers, and financial records of CRHS shall be held separately and apart from those of the CMRC. Each entity shall file their own reports, as required, to the State of Tennessee and the Internal Revenue Service of the United States.
5. All members in good standing of the Crossville Model Railroad Club shall be granted full membership in the Crossville Railroad Historical Society. They will retain the same rights and privileges as defined in the CMRC bylaws, policies and procedures.
6. The Society shall not impose any additional financial obligations on its members without their approval.
7. A suspension or revocation of membership in CMRC will result in a suspension or revocation of membership in CRHS.
8. Except for the position of Treasurer, the elected officers of the Crossville Model Railroad Club shall also be the acting officers of the Crossville Railroad Historical Society.
9. The position of Treasurer will be for a two-year term. The election will be held in October of odd numbered years with nominations occurring at the previous regularly scheduled meeting of the Society.
10. The business of the Society shall be conducted on the same dates as the CMRC but fully separated from it. One meeting must be adjourned before the other is initiated.
11. The objectives of the Society include presenting and teaching about the history of railroads that existed in Crossville and the surrounding areas of the Cumberland Plateau through the use of interactive displays, library services, and other activities dedicated to model railroading.

- 12.** To advance and promote the hobby of model railroading, and to provide a meeting ground and educational programs for the sharing of knowledge and interests among model railroaders and the general public including school children.
- 13.** Maintain a library and museum exhibits of railroad related publications, publications, video, and artifacts.
- 14.** To raise funds and pay the bills to build, equip and maintain a structure and property suitable for completing the objectives stated in 11, 12, and 13.
